Kerygma is not a new effort, rather Jesus was the first to proclaim the full Kerygma message. The early Church grew because of the proclamation of the Kerygma by the Apostles and Church Fathers.



- Kerygma is not a new ministry or a recruiting effort for new ministers. The retreat serves to build the parish community. When the community builds, more people will offer to serve the parish.
- Kerygma does not propose a specific spirituality, rather it invites all into an authentic Christian way of life. While the proclamation of the Kerygma is foundational, it incorporates Scripture, Tradition, Liturgy, personal experience of Jesus, and the witness of others to bring participants to Christ.



♦ Kerygma is not a clique. All are welcome to hear the proclamation and share in the mission of the Church. One of the goals of the retreat is to encourage the participants to invite others to a relationship with Jesus and the Church.


